East Troy Railroad Museum

The East Troy Railroad Museum operates on the last remaining piece of the original Wisconsin interurban network. By 1939, the railroad was retired by The Milwaukee Electric Railway & Light Company. Since everything from gas to groceries came to East Troy by our line, the town passed a referendum to purchase the remaining 7.5 mile stretch of track and overhead for freight purposes. The Village of East Troy operated the railroad until the year 2000 when it was purchased by the Friends of East Troy Railroad, which today has 32 pieces of equipment with over 500 members worldwide, 110 active volunteers and 15,000 visitors each year!
